

Human Amniotic Allograft

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Patient is 33 years old female that was participating in soccer when she rolled her ankle and heard a “snap.” She has a history of ankle ligament repair and drilling of osteochondral defect.



She was treated conservatively with no improvement. The decision was made to perform ankle arthroscopy with debridement of synovitis and osteochondral lesion with placement of Human amniotic allograft into the ankle held in place with fibrin glue. The patient also had open repair of lateral ankle ligaments.



The patient was back to normal activity and back to running within 4 months of surgery. At 10 months, she had no pain and full range of motion.
